





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## Government Guidance to the Local Authorities and Schools








## What is Wraparound Childcare?

- Wraparound childcare is <u>paid for childcare</u> for primary school aged children during term time, this wraps around the traditional school day.
- This means before school and after school provision that runs daily.
- This is expected to be available between 8am and 6pm.
- The aim is to support working parents and those going back into the workforce.
- The government are not paying for places this is to be paid for by the parents/ carers.







# What role does the PVI Sector have?

- A Wraparound provider is anyone who delivers wraparound provision
- The PVI sector is an integral part of this service to parents
- Promotion of what Wraparound childcare you offer to new and existing parents
- Promotion of Tax-Free Childcare, Childcare Choices and FYI
- Work with your local school on what the offer is
- Keeping the LA up to date with any changes for demand for places

## Do all primary schools need to offer this?

**No**. While the government "expects" all schools to provide wraparound childcare, this is only non-statutory guidance.

However, all schools are expected to "identify how you can support parents" to access childcare.

Where schools can't provide provision, they are expected to work "collaboratively" with the Local Authority through the school signposting parents to alternative local provision, for example PVIs and childminders.

The local authority will identify all childcare providers who offer pick up and drop offs to each school and with your permission share with the schools.



## What is the current data telling us?

#### **Bradford has 53011 children at Primary School**

(School Census data Oct 2023)

#### **8014 places for Before School Childcare**

(15% of the whole school population)

#### 5152 places for After School Childcare

(10% of the whole school population)

159 providers offer the full entitlement (8-6pm)

(31 schools offer 8-6pm)

237 providers offer part of the entitlement

(108 schools offer a part offer, of these 73 offer Before school only)

Current out of school providers are reporting vacancies



There are only 2 schools in Bradford who do not have any known current linked childcare providers

#### What is the Demand?

- This needs to be paid for childcare and self sustaining
- We have parents coming through the system now who have been used to 30 hours funded childcare but have been stretching the hours and paying for extra childcare
- Promote the use of Tax Free Childcare support and all childcare support benefits





What role does the LA have in the delivery of the wraparound programme?

The programme will be delivered through local authorities, given their existing sufficiency duty.

The Local Authority should use the funding available to them to create additional places and ensure existing places are available for the hours that are required, to:

- meet current demand both in terms of number of places and hours available;
- ensure supply to build further demand; and
- where required, as traditional models of wraparound may not support sustainable provision, test new approaches to identify what works in their local area and identify the level of risk.

Local authorities will work collaboratively and in partnership with wraparound providers to deliver the programme.



### What the LA have been doing to prepare?

- Writing DfE and local action plans
- Gathering and cleansing the data on the supply of places
- Developing plans for each School
- Gathering information about demand for places
- Looking at support we can offer particularly around SEND
- Looking at our current systems and processes
- FYI is a new site which has been developed to make it easier for parents to navigate and find childcare
- Exploring developing a digital solution which each school can have on their website which will tell parents what Wraparound the school offers as well as who are the providers who drop off and collect from their school.

# Is there financial support to open a provision?

- If there is a need identified the LA is developing a development/support package.
- There will be an application process

#### The Support may cover some or all of the following:

- ☐Business models for you to use to assess your breakeven
- □Initial setup costs to develop a high-quality and sustainable wraparound provision (such as additional equipment- toys- consumables etc)
- ☐ Staffing costs up to breakeven (Pump Priming)
- □ Promotion costs
- □Training around SEND/Inclusion



#### Programme Delivery Funding

The Department for Education have allocated Bradford Council £962,533 Capital Funding 2023-2026.

The funding is for use across both programmes

- 30-hours entitlement places for children aged 9-months to 3-year-olds
- Wraparound provision for primary school aged children



Decisions on the use of the capital funding will be determined once the data analysis for working families and the wrapround is completed by June 2024.

There is no revenue start-up funding for the working families entitlement expansion programme

## Local Authority next steps

- Gain consent from the PVI providers to share their details with the schools they offer wraparound to.
- Produce a profile for each School
- Develop a tool and questionnaire to help support those exploring offering wraparound
- Develop a digital solution that each school can have on their website so parents can find all the wraparound care linked to their school
- Assess areas where we need to develop provision and work with those schools and PVI providers
- Parental demand research
- Work with providers to extend their hours to meet the full wraparound offer
- Wraparound childcare for children with SEND



## What steps we recommend the schools & PVI take

- Answer the consent questionnaire promptly
- Work with other local wraparound providers and the schools you offer drop-offs to and pick-ups from, on what you offer
- Report back to the LA where demand is identified and assist with the demand research
- Discuss with the LA any future intentions for wraparound development
- Respond to surveys around wraparound sent to you by the LA
- Promote Tax-Free Childcare and FYI on your website/ to your parents.
- When the wraparound digital solution is available promote on your website if you have one.
