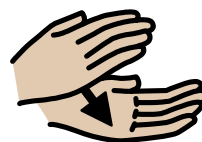























Syllables



A syllable consists of one or more letters which must include at least one vowel sound. It can be a word or part of a word.

Sometimes syllables are called beats or claps.
