Games and activities to develop number recognition to 10





Create a tactile box with objects that will interest the pupil. Include numbers, objects to count and objects to sort into and allow the child to play. Encourage identifying the numbers as playing and counting the given number of objects.



Make a number feely bag for a target number. Play feely bag games – can the pupil guess what the objects are and count them out. Alternatively, use the bag to go on a number walk. Use a picture tick list showing pictures of objects to be found, e.g. 2 pencils, 2 cubes etc. (include numicon shapes and plastic numbers).





Find a book / rhyme / song about the target number and share with the child.

Feely bag activities – can they identify a number by touch alone? Can they find a number you say?



Make a focus number display / collection of resources. Make a number book. Create a number box.
