HILL TOP CHURCH of ENGLAND (Foundation) PRIMARY SCHOOL

ADMISSION POLICY STATEMENT (2019 - 20)

Children are admitted to Hill Top C of E Primary School (Reception) on a full time basis from the beginning of the school year in which they become five. Parents do have the right to take up the place on a part-time basis or to defer entry until the child is of statutory school age. A child becomes of compulsory school age when he or she reaches the age of five and must start school in the term following his or her fifth birthday (unless a child is educated otherwise).

The school admission number is 30.

Special Educational Needs

The admission of pupils with a statement of Special Educational Needs is dealt with by a completely separate procedure and such children will be admitted to the school named on the statement.

If the number of applications for Hill Top exceeds the number of places available, priority will be given to children in the following categories:

1 Looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order.

2 Brothers and sisters of children resident at the same address who are at present on roll at the school and will still be attending the school at the time of application. (see notes below)

3a) The children of parents/guardians who are practising members of the Church of England or other Christian denominations and whose home address is within the Parish of Holy Trinity. (Parents will need to ask their minister/pastor to provide a confidential reference which is attached to the supplementary information form) (see notes below)

3b) The children of parents/guardians who are practising members of the Church of England or other Christian denominations and whose home address is beyond the traditional Parish of Holy Trinity but whose family have a sustained (a minimum of two years) and committed relationship with Holy Trinity Church. (Parents will need to ask their minister/pastor to provide a confidential reference which is attached to the supplementary information form) (see notes below)

A copy of the parish of Holy Trinity is attached to this policy.

4 Children with special medical or social reasons for admission and where a place at Hill Top Church of England Primary School is deemed essential by an appropriate independent professional written recommendation

5 All other children

Tie breaker

When demand exceeds places in any of the above criteria, the distance between home and school, measured by a straight line, from the main entrance of the home to the main entrance of the school building, will be used to decide who is given a place; those living nearest being given the available places. In the event of a tie, a random allocation will take place.

Notes

1. Sisters and brothers refer to children who reside with the same family at the same address. Children living with the same family e.g. foster children and step sisters and brothers are also included.
2. "Resident" refers to the pupil's permanent home at the time of admission. Where two people, both of whom live at separate addresses hold parental responsibility, it is for the parents to determine which address is to be used for the allocation.

4. If a twin or one or more children from multiple births are offered place(s), siblings will also be offered places even if this takes the school beyond the school admissions number.

Application Procedure

(Please note all dates are in common with the Local Authority Admissions Scheme)

Parents wishing to apply for a place at Hill Top CE Primary School must:

* Complete the common application form which is available from the school or Local Authority and this should be returned to the school or to Local Authority by the deadline date of 15 January each year.

* If applying on faith grounds (criterion 3 above), complete the supplementary information form which is available from the school and which should be **returned directly to the school** by the Friday before 15 January each year.

* On the prescribed date Local Authority will return to Hill Top an Excel spreadsheet containing all the information that the parent has written on the form relating to Hill Top from all those who have indicated Hill Top as a preference.

* The Governors will then apply the admission criteria to the returned forms.

* On the prescribed date the Governors will return to Local Authority a list, in rank order, with details of the admission criteria met, those children who will be offered a place.

Offer of Places

On 16 April 2019, Local Authority will write to all parents informing them of the allocated school place.

Waiting List

The Local Authority will establish a waiting list for children not offered a place. The list will be made up of any parent who appeals for a place or who indicates that they want to be placed on the list without an appeal. The list will be kept for the rest of the academic

year for which application was made. This list will be maintained in the order of the admission criteria and not when a name is entered on the list.

Once the allocation letters have been sent out by Local Authority, on behalf of Hill Top CE Primary School, any questions about waiting lists should be made to the school.

Casual Admissions and Transfers (In year)

We actively encourage all applicants for admission to Hill Top CE Primary School outside the normal admission round to be made in consultation with the Headteacher.

In-year applications should be made on the Local Authority's (LA) common application form which should be returned to the LA's Admissions Team. If applying on faith grounds, however, parents will also need to complete the school's supplementary form which should be returned to the school. If a place is available, governors will offer the place. If no places are available at the time of application, parent(s) / carer(s) will be informed of this and invited to be placed on the school's waiting list. The waiting list is maintained in the order of the oversubscription criteria above.

Parents/carers will be informed of the outcome of the application by the LA, on behalf of the Governors.

Parents, who wish their child to transfer to a different school once he or she has started, should discuss this with the child's current Headteacher. Transfers can only normally take place at the start of a full term, unless there are special reasons.

Right of Appeal

Parents have the right of appeal if they have been refused entry into Reception during the allocation process or to any other year group. Second or subsequent appeals will not be considered within the same academic year unless there has been a significant change in circumstances such as a house removal.
