Safeguarding Disabled Children - Working in the Margins

A ONE DAY MULTI-AGENCY COURSE

Target Audience

This course is for **experienced practitioners who work directly with disabled children, young people and their families.**

Course aims and objectives

The course aims to give participants 'the space and time' for guided exploration of the current themes and practice issues relevant to their work in safeguarding disabled children and young people. It requires a commitment from practitioners to play an active role in reflecting and sharing experiences from practice.

The objectives of the course will be to:

Identify themes arising from recent research, publications and Serious Case Reviews; specifically in relation to Disabled Children.

Discuss what the potential barriers are to promoting resilience and minimising risk for disabled children and young people.

Recognise the behaviours of professionals and families who are 'in conflict'.

Describe some of the influences which can enhance and/or inhibit building and maintaining effective professional relationships.

Explain how reflective supervision can enhance professional practice

By the end of the session participants will be able to *Explain* multiple factors involved in the effective safeguarding of disabled children and young people.
