

The Anne Frank Ambassadors Programme

Following the in-school programme, we invite those students who have been inspired by Anne's message during their time as exhibition guides to become Anne Frank Ambassadors. These students will join a growing and dynamic network of Ambassadors around the country who volunteer to spread Anne's story and message of hope to primary schools in their local community.

Over a two day seminar, we bring together Ambassadors from a number of local schools, and support the Ambassadors to develop a presentation and set of resources to help them introduce Anne Frank to Year 6 students.

Introducing the Anne Frank Schools Programme

Since 2006, we've worked with hundreds of schools across the UK. We have developed the Anne Frank Schools Programme, which is a unique and exciting opportunity for your students to explore Anne's story and the history of Holocaust, and to develop their thinking and shape their attitudes on issues that affect them in the 21st century.

The Anne Frank Schools Programme has two core elements: an in-school programme, and the Anne Frank Ambassadors Programme

The In-school Programme

Over a two-week period, we bring our acclaimed exhibition Anne Frank: A History for Today to your school. This exhibition explores Anne's story and the history of the Holocaust. We train a group of your students to guide other young people around the exhibition, using the strength of peer-education to discover and discuss the Holocaust, and to explore Anne's message of hope in the face of adversity.

In parallel to the exhibition, we deliver a range of workshops to students across the school that complement the exhibition, around five related themes:

- Understanding Prejudice
- Responsibility and Resistance
- The Historical Context of the Holocaust
- Human Rights
- Identity and Diversity
