## **Stand Up, Speak Out, Make a Difference**

for primary schools is a two day programme designed to challenge prejudice and identity-based bullying, and explore ways in which young people can use their voice constructively for society. It comprises of workshops delivered by staff from Bradford Council and The Anne Frank Trust, and a peer education element. Pupils are encouraged to develop critical thinking skills and empathy for others.

### **Day 1**

In the morning we work with a year 5 or 6 class exploring the concepts of stereotyping, prejudice and discrimination using Anne Frank's story to provide a context. The workshop activities include small group work, whole class discussion and illustrative video clips.

### **Days 1 and 2**

On the afternoon of day one and the morning of day two we work with an ambassador group of around 8 children on an aspect of prejudice or bullying that they would like to address. The pupils develop their ideas and devise a creative way to present them, with our support, in order to share their learning with their peers.

### **Day 2**

On the afternoon of day two the ambassadors deliver an assembly showcasing their learning and delivering their message to a year group, key stage or the whole school.

The programme can be adapted if you have more than one class in the year group.
