

## Delivery Models

There are many different flexible packages that a school can adopt to deliver the 30 hour entitlement but these must be within the parameters set out in the statutory guidance, these are:

- no session to be longer than 10 hours
- no minimum session length (subject to the requirements of registration on the Ofsted Early Years Register)
- not before 6.00am or after 8.00pm
- a maximum of two sites in a single day

This guidance sets out some of the options for delivering both the universal and extended entitlement but does not cover them all.

### **Multi provider partnership**

For schools that are unable to offer the extended entitlement, working in partnership with local childcare providers may be an option. There are different types of partnerships, these can be on-site or off-site. An example of an on-site partnership is where a child attends a breakfast club run on the school site and an example of an off-site partnership is where the school works with a local childcare provider (such as a childminder or day nursery) who can deliver the extended 15 hours. Working in partnership allows schools, that cannot or do not want to offer the full 30 hours, to meet the demand of their parents that are eligible to access the extended entitlement. The illustration on the next page depicts an example of what a partnership between different childcare providers can look like. This particular example illustrates a partnership between a breakfast club (on the school site), a school and childminder.




# Out-of-school provider, maintained school and childminder partnership



## Possible models for school self-delivery

Please find below visual illustrations of what possible models for delivering the 30 hour entitlement in schools can look like. This has been colour coded to illustrate where the funded hours can be allocated and where the voluntary chargeable hours can be allocated (colour key below). Please note that the statutory guidance clearly sets out that any hours that fall outside of the funding (e.g lunch time or at the end of the day) should not be made as a condition of offering a place, these must be voluntary and parents must have the option of an alternative. With each possible model there will be a discussion around how it works and what considerations/arrangements may need to be made.

In this model schools will offer the funded hours for children eligible to access 30 hours for 6 hours a day, from 8.45am-2.45pm (including a lunch club). The last 45 minutes from 2.45-3.30pm every day is where parents can have the option to collect their child or alternatively parents can pay for that hour that sits outside of the funded hours, if that is what they wish to do.

### Considerations:

- If children who are accessing the extended entitlement are being picked up at 2.45pm there will need to be a process in place to organise the children who are leaving and for a member (or members) of staff to oversee their pick up.

## Delivery model 2:

In this model, children will receive the funded hours for the universal and extended entitlement from 8.45am-3.30pm for 4 full days during the week (including a lunch club). There will be one afternoon session during the week that is non-funded and you can offer this afternoon to parents as a paid afternoon, or an afternoon where they can pick up their child.

Considerations:

- Arrangements will need to be made for members of staff to supervise the pickup of the children who will be leaving after the lunch club one day a week.

### Delivery model 3:

In this model, children will receive their 30 funded hours during the morning and afternoon sessions over 5 days of the week, from 8.45-11.45am and 12.30-3.30pm. There is a chargeable lunch club every day from 11.45am-12.30pm.

Considerations:

- It is important to note that the Operational Guidance<sup>1</sup> sets out on page 32 that “children should be able to take up their free hours as part of continuous provision and providers should avoid artificial breaks in the day wherever possible. For example, the lunch time hour/session should form part of the free provision where the child is attending a morning and afternoon session”
- Invoicing arrangements will need to be made and administrative costs/time to do this will need to be considered
