

## Interested in 'Growing Your Own' Teachers?

*Do you have a graduate working or volunteering in your school ready to train to teach?*

If so, the **Bradford Birth to 19 SCITT** is able to provide **funded opportunities** to have your staff trained to become teachers while continuing to work at your school. **We are currently enrolling for September 2017 start.**

*How does the training programme work?*



**School Direct Salaried** trainees train in your school and are released 2 days a week for the first half term, followed by a day a week until Easter 2017 to follow a training programme for one academic year. The training has been written by schools and is delivered by their outstanding practitioners. Training in a school setting means that trainees can observe teaching, practice their skills and become confident teachers, ready to be regularly good as NQTs.

If you are interested in finding out more about becoming a school providing training, just get in touch. The Bradford Birth to 19 SCITT is run by St Edmund's Nursery School in partnership with other schools in our Teaching School Alliance.

*How do finances work?*

For trainees enrolling on our School Direct Salaried Programme, we are able to allocate £9,000 of funding to schools for each trainee placed in a school. This is paid to schools by us. The school needs to cover any additional salary payments, including on-costs. They also need to pay £4000 per trainee to the SCITT.

*What qualifications and experience are needed?*

Applicants will need GCSE English and Maths and Science at grade C or better, a minimum 2:2 degree and typically 3 years of work experience, some of it working with children, by the time they start training.
