An opportunity to see, hear and experience a primary school's engagement with Investors in Pupils, including a learning walk and presentations from staff and pupils and the central Investors in Pupils team.

Aim: This event is for colleagues responsible for introducing "Investors in Pupils" and / or coordinating pupil voice and participation in schools. Also relevant for members of the Senior Leadership Team and/or those who want to learn more about the award and the positive impact it can have on the whole school community.

Outcomes: By the end of the event delegates will have an understanding of:

- how staff have introduced and developed 'Investors in Pupils', ensuring consistent provision over a number years with changing staff
- how pupils are engaged and have a voice in developing policy and management systems in school including the anti-bullying policy, race equality policy, behaviour policy, Teaching and Learning policy
- the measurable impact 'Investors in Pupils' can have on the whole school community
- how to prepare for an assessment, and what to expect from the assessment day

Cost: £75 per delegate

Investors in Pupils provides a quality framework within which schools and educational settings can develop, embed and enhance pupil voice and participation strategies. It provides opportunities for children and young people to take greater responsibility for their own education and behaviour across five main areas; learning; behaviour; attendance (including punctuality); school and classroom management, and induction.

Hawksworth Wood Primary School The school serves an urban area of Leeds. While most pupils are of white British/ European heritage, there are a growing number of pupils from Black and other minority heritage groups with 13 different languages currently spoken in school. The number of pupils known to be eligible for free school meals is above average. The school continues to outperform schools in similar circumstances and attributes one of the key factors in this success to be the 'Investors in Pupils' programme as it promotes such a positive attitude amongst its pupils.
