Study and Organisational Skills - Top Tips

- Make notes on timetables for each lesson throughout the curriculum, for exampletextbooks and equipment needed.
- At the beginning of lessons get everything you need out ready. Make sure you have all of your belongings and equipment at the end.
- As soon as homework has been given make a note of it. Ask a friend or the teacher if you are not sure.
- Prioritise homework- make sure you complete homework in the order that it needs to be handed in.
- You could colour code your timetable to show when completed homework needs to be handed in.
- If you are finding it difficult to complete homework speak to the teacher first or your parents.
- Each evening plan and organise what you need for the following day (think about textbooks, sports equipment etc.).
- Try and get into a routine. For every piece of homework you complete reward yourself in some way.

Key questions for students to improve organisational skills

Before leaving home:

- Have you got your pencil case, textbooks, exercise books and homework diary for each of the lessons you have today?
- Have you got all of the homework which needs to be handed in today?
- Do you need to bring your sports equipment to school today?

For each lesson:

- Do you know where the next lesson is and what time it starts?
- Do you need a map of the school to find your way around?
- Do you know where to sit in class where you can concentrate without being distracted? Can you see the board easily?
- Do you need to hand in your homework during this lesson?
- Have you made a note of the homework and hand-in date in your homework diary?

Checklist for secondary students in preparation for essay or assignment writing

Place a tick by each completed task.

- 1. Write down your initial thoughts as to how the question could be answered.
- 2. Gather together the notes, textbooks, reference books and photocopied material that could be used to help you answer the question.
- 3. Examine how you could use the selected material to answer the question and organise it into a logical order. It may be helpful to use a highlighter and/or post it notes to identify key points.
