Communication and Cancellation Statement

There is high demand for support from our team which we continually balance with the capacity we have. Therefore, I'd like to share the following:

- To organise any support that has been initiated by the school or setting, we will attempt communication 3 times (one of these attempts will include an email to the head teacher/manager's email address).
- If there is no reply after the 3 attempts, we will assume that the support is no longer required.
- If any planned support is cancelled by the school /setting with less than 2 working days' notice, it may be that the planned support will not be able to be rearranged and will be relinquished.
