

Learning Support Service – Accessible Books. Agreement for Non-Maintained Schools.

A print-disabled person is anyone for whom a visual, cognitive or physical disability hinders the ability to read print. This includes all visual impairments, dyslexia, and any physical disabilities that prevent the handling of a physical copy of a print publication.

In order that the Learning Support Service can effectively share digital copies of works with schools and settings in compliance with copyright law, we have to take reasonable steps to ensure that service-users understand their responsibilities. We would be grateful if you could read and sign the following...

- I confirm that the school holds a current CLA (The Copyright Licensing Agency Ltd) licence and have attached a copy to this agreement.
- The school will have lawful possession or lawful use of an original copy of any work which it requests from LSS Accessible Books.
- The digital copy, and any Accessible Copy produced from it, will only to be used for the benefit of Authorised Persons.
- The digital copy will be stored securely and deleted at the end of the course of study for which it was made, or the end of the academic year in which it was received, whichever is sooner.
