As a district, it is our vision to draw on the energy, experience and effort of the whole system so that babies, children and young people have a great start in life and improved life chances going forward. The provision of public health services for 0-19 (currently health visiting, school nursing and oral health), are essential to this approach and key to enabling positive change and working as a whole system. Bradford district intends to provide integrated support to families to support prevention work and to provide interventions where needed at the earliest opportunity to improve outcomes and reducing inequalities for babies, children and young people. This will reduce the demand for late and specialist services by providing intense support to those most in need of extra help with interventions and support based on the best available evidence of what works. This approach recognises and values the expertise of all service providers and the creative and dynamic gains to be made through working together.

❖ **We want to commission a Public Health 0-19 Children's Service which:**

- Is based on the needs of our babies, children, young people and families
- Is outcome and inequalities focused and ambitious
- Is innovative and forward thinking in approach and able to be organised to respond to needs flexibly and positively.
- Is fully committed and able to work as part of an integrated system, specifically the proposed Prevention and Early Help model for the district
- Provides a Healthy Child Programme from the antenatal period, 0-19 years for children, young people and families, with transitional support to children and young people with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) up to 25 years
- Includes both universal and targeted services focused on:
  - Pregnancy, birth and early years including the five mandated health checks
  - Delivery of the Healthy Child Programme 0-19 years
  - Delivery focused on High Impact Areas
  - Evidence based interventions which will be outcomes focused
  - Oral health Improvement programmes
- Supports parents, promotes child development, improves child health outcomes, reduces inequalities and ensures that families at risk are identified early.
