Trafficking

Do you know...

Child Trafficking involves: recruitment, transportation, receiving or harbouring a child, typically for some form of exploitation for someone else's gain. Children can be given **money, goods or possessions**; they may have periods of absence and be **'missing'**. Some children are trafficked from abroad but children can also be trafficked from one part of the UK to another, even from street to street. This **INTERNAL TRAFFICKING** occurs to some young people unknowingly and can be hard to detect.

Child Criminal Exploitation

Do you know...

CCE happens when children are exploited or coerced into committing criminal acts such as theft, arson, holding money or violent offences. 'County Lines' refers to organised criminal groups targeting and using children to act as drug runners. Gangs often target children who are **vulnerable, living in care, trapped in poverty, unloved**, have **mental health** or **drug issues** as they can take advantage of this. Dedicated mobile phone 'lines' are utilised to organise the 'drug running' from cities to rural areas. Young people are often **threatened** with **violence** and unable to escape.



Child Sexual Exploitation

Do you know...

(CSE) is when young people up to the age of 18 are manipulated or forced into taking part in sexual activity. They may be given something they want or need, possibly **attention, money, food, alcohol** or **somewhere to stay**. This can often look like a consenting relationship but in all cases, those exploiting the young person have **power** over them and will put them into **dangerous** situations, **forcing** them to do things that they didn't want to do.

Gangs

Do you know...

There are over 7000 criminal gangs operating in the UK. Children and young people can be targeted into street gang involvement and groomed to take part in dangerous and criminal activities. Some young people are attracted to growing gang culture for **Protection, Friendship, Identity, Money, Status** etc. But risks far outweigh any benefits. 'Slipping' can mean a gang member is caught off guard or is in the wrong area/territory, Slipping can get a young person **robbed, beaten up, raped, stabbed** or **killed**. Consequences can be lifelong.

Knife Crime

Do you know...

Some young people carry weapons to feel **protected**, because of **peer pressure** or to feel **powerful**. Knife crime is not exclusive to gangs and can affect everyone. Situations involving weapons can get out of control very easily. People who carry weapons are more likely to be **threatened, attacked, injured, hurt others, arrested** or **killed**.

Radicalisation

Do you know...

Radicalisation is when someone starts to believe or support extreme views. Extremist views can lead to harmful or illegal activities such as **discrimination, violence**, or **hate**. Extremists' can target children telling them they can be part of something special. Children and young people can be particularly vulnerable to radicalisation when they are feeling **lonely, unhappy, judged, stressed, bullied** or **angry** and **confused** about what they see other people or the government doing.
